



## University of Washington To Have Seismograph

BOSCH-OMORI seismograph has A been ordered by the University of Washington and will arrive during the summer and be set up near the Science Hall on the college grounds. This device for detecting motions of the earth is so sensitive that disturbances of the earth's crust a quarter way around the world are recorded by it.

The machine the university has ordered will be the best of the kind west of the Mississippi and north of San Francisco. It has been shipped from Germany and will arrive during the vacation season and be ready when college opens next fall. A substantial base will be erected on which the sensitive machine will be placed. This is imperative in order that the passing cars and wagons near by will not affect the dial.

Board of Fark Commissioners Will Present Plan for Improvement Through

Further action on the repealing ordinance, taking from the purk beard authority to condemn a tract of land through the McGlivra Addition, was deferred by the streets, parks and boulevards committees of the city council at 2 joint meeting yesterday afternoon.

Ford admitted that he might change his mind if he was shown a survey and complete action was deferred until July 2, when the park board will submit such survey and plans.

# GRAND JURY

Mayor Moore Says He Is Willing That the Renton Hill Club Should Have an Investigation if One Is Wanted.

If the Renton Hill Improvement Club wants a grand jury it, can have one for all Mayor W. H. Moore cares. The resolution to be considered by that organization tonight demanding a special inquiry into county and municipal affairs will not disturb the equinmity of the city's executive. One of the principal reasons why the peace of mind of the mayor was not disturbed was that he did not know the club would take up the resolution until the morning had nearly passed. Then he accepted the incidents as one of those things that come into the life of a public official without doing any harm.
"If the Renton Hill Improvement Club wants a grand jury, I don't care," said Mayor Moore this morning. "It is a matter of no concern to me whether a grand jury or anybody elso investigates the affairs of the mayor's office. I have not asked that a grand jury look into anybody's else affairs and I am not going to, but if some one wants to include this office in the scope of a grand jury's investigations, it's all right.

"I have been so busy that I have paid no attention to matters outside the office and I did not know the Renton Hill Club wanted a grand jury or that it proposed to ask one. In fact, my mind has been so concentrated on this mass of work that if some one had asked me suddenly what the Renton Hill Club was I couldn't have answered. But it's all right. If they want a grand jury I have no objections."

The announcement that the Renton Hill Club may ask for a grand jury did not create much of a flurry in the city hall. A corps of experts was investigating this morning just as though there was no grand jury cloud hovering near by. The school board worried along under threat of investigation and carried out a mearranged plan to send experts to look over the books of the old Ballard district. Then the school board instructed its regular expert to make his usual investigation of the Seattle district's books. That is done periodically and it happened that today was the regular period for his employment. There was an absence of excitement at the city hall.
